Christopher Hall is the former principal clarinet of the Orchestre Metropolitain in Montréal (Yannick Nézet-Seguin) who found work in the orchestra far too serious!

So now, instead of joking around in orchestra, he performs as a stand up comedian, and does various television and radio shows in both English and French.

He has appeared in such prestigious Comedy festivals as the Just for Laughs, The Winnipeq Comedy Fest, and the Grand Rire in Quebec City.

Last Summer, he performed his "Comic Orchestra" show at the Just for Laughs festival in front of a crowd of 3000, to rave reviews.

In 2010, he had the honour of doing an opener for the great Bill Cosby and the following year, he hosted Whoopi Goldberg's show in Quebec City.

He has hosted travel shows for CTV, and won two Gémeaux awards (French Gemini award).

Christopher is fluent in English, French, German and Italian. But whatever you do, DO NOT take this man seriously!
